This year's Holy Week Festival opens with the world-renowned vocal ensemble, The Tallis Scholars. All these Renaissance composers worked in the Sistine Chapel and wrote for the choir there. Quite a number of the pieces can be identified as having been specifically written for that building. Campkin's Miserere Mei is a direct response to the renowned Allegri setting of the same psalm. The framework of the programme is a composite mass by Palestrina.


A docking station is located in Smith Square and there are also stations on Horseferry Road, Page Street and Great College Street.
